

Origin of Maundy – The name Maundy is derived from the Latin word "Mandatum" meaning a Commandment.

Jesus Christ, at the Last Supper, commanded: "and now I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." John 15: 12.

Maundy Thursday is the day before Good Friday.

Maundy Thursday Ceremony

In Britain today, the Queen follows a very traditional role of giving Maundy money to a group of Pensioners. This ceremony dates back to the reign of the sovereign Edward 1.

Every year on this day, the Queen attends a Royal Maundy service in one of the many Cathedrals throughout the country. Maundy money is distributed to male and female pensioners from local communities near the Cathedral where the Service takes place. The amount handed out and the number of receiving the coins is related to the years of the Sovereign's life.

Pineapple Pudding

Ingredients

425 g can of pineapple pieces. 300 ml milk approx...

50 g butter 50 g flour

125 g caster sugar 2 eggs, separated

Heat the oven to 325 degrees F / 160 degrees C/ gas mark 3.

Drain the syrup from the pineapple into a measure and make up to 450ml with milk.

Melt the butter in a saucepan, stir in the flour and cook for a minute.

Add the milk mixture and bring to the boil, stirring, until the sauce has thickened. Cook for 2 minutes, then stir in 40 g of the cater sugar until dissolved. Remove from the heat and beat in the egg yolks. Stir in the pineapple pieces and turn the mixture into a 1.5 litre oven proof dish.

Whisk the egg whites with a electric or hand rotary whisk until stiff, then whisk in the remaining sugar a teaspoonful at a time. Pile the meringue on top of the pineapple mixture, making sure that it comes right to the edge of the dish. Bake in the oven for about 30 minutes, until the meringue is a pale golden brown and crisp. This pudding should be served warm. Serves 4 to 6 people.

Coconut Macaroons

4 oz desiccated coconut 1 Tablespoon Self Raising flour

3 Tablespoons caster sugar 1 egg

Mix the dry ingredients together and add the beaten egg, form into pyramids, place on a baking tray.

Cook for 15 minutes at 180 degrees C / gas mark 4.


